From the Vicar: All are welcome

The autumn at Great St Mary's is always filled with a rich variety of special Sunday Services, which started with our patronal festival on September 8th, when we also blessed the bicycles. This year has been even more diverse than usual, with the licensing of Revd Ally and the commissioning of the Bishop's Officer for the Homeless, Kristian Hewitt, who then returned to preach for Homelessness Sunday two weeks later. This was followed by civic occasions such as the Chevin Sermon, when we also celebrated our Harvest Festival, and the High Sheriff's Justice Service. As we move into November, we will celebrate All



Saints and All Souls on November 3rd, the latter with the Duruflé Requiem in a Eucharist for the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed. A week later we host the Remembrance Sunday Service for the City and the University. And this term, two stimulating university sermons in Great St Mary's, which provide inspiring food for thought. There are, of course, 'regular' services, such as the 8am Holy Communion, Choral Evensong and our mid-week worship ranging from the ARK communion service to silent meditation group in Michaelhouse; the mid-week communion service and Choral Evensong.

I have named these different types of services as they reflect the diverse communities Great St Mary's is called to serve, with its regular congregations of people who in themselves bring together people from different walks of life and countries, old and young. Each autumn, new people come to join us, and we are delighted to welcome them.

I have now been the vicar of Great St Mary's for just over a year, and I continue to be amazed and excited by the people who are part of Great St Mary's, as members of our congregations, the University, the wider community and our visitors, who come into our buildings to pray, seek a place to rest or to enjoy the beautiful historic spaces. By being open seven days a week, in the centre of Cambridge, we offer something very important and unique – a place where people encounter God.

The PCC has started to address the question 'As generous and visible people of Jesus Christ, who are we called to serve at Great St Mary's? Who are we serving well? Where could we do better? Who are we missing? In January we will spend a Saturday at a PCC away day to work with these questions, identify a vision and priorities for the years ahead. If you have any thoughts on these questions, which you would like to feed into the process, please speak to any of our PCC members, clergy or email us. We would love to hear from you.

In this eMag, I'd like to especially draw your attention to the Pastoral Care section, which has been updated and includes information about our 'Intercessors at home' and how to ask for prayer, confidentially, for yourself and someone dear to you. We are grateful for their faithful ministry of prayer supporting individuals and the life of our church.

Revd Canon Christine Farrington



The Revd Canon Christine Farrington, has died at the age of 82. She was an assistant minister at Great St Mary's and then Vicar of St Mark's, Cambridge, Chaplain of Wolfson College, and a Chaplain to the Queen. She was an Hon. Canon of Ely Cathedral and joint director of ordinands and director of women's ministry for the Diocese of Ely. Christine was one of the first women to be ordained in 1994 and preached at a special service in Salisbury Cathedral in 2004 to celebrate ten years of women's ministry as priests in the Church of England, attended by more than 100 women priests from Wiltshire and Dorset.




